Aluminium	Local recycling points ³	Place clean aluminium in the red recycling column at the local recycling points (processed together with tin). Composite materials such as butter packaging, glitter paper, drink pouches, soup packets, etc. must not be disposed of together with aluminium. Larger aluminium parts must be put ready for metal collection ² .
Animal carcasses	Werkhof Oberwil	Animal carcasses up to 50 kilograms can be taken to Werkhof Oberwil by prior arrangement (telephone). Disposal of carcasses weighing up to 10 kilograms is free of charge.
		The charge is CHF 1.50 per kilogram from 10 kilograms upwards, with a minimum charge of CHF 20.00.

	Basel carcass collection point	Carcasses weighing more than 50 kilograms must be disposed of directly at the carcass collection point in Basel.

Ashes	Household	Leave ashes to cool and dispose of them in a sealed bag in household waste.
	waste	As coal or wood ashes may contain pollutants, please do not dispose of via the biodegradable waste container or use as fertiliser.
Batteries	Trade	Return to point of sale. Batteries must not be disposed of with household waste.
Biodegradable waste	House-to-house collection ²	 All kinds of <u>unpackaged</u> kitchen waste, including cooked or processed items such as meat and cheese.
(garden and kitchen waste)		 Green waste such as lawn clippings and leaves.
Kitchen waste)		 Biodegradable sacks are permitted, but not required. No plastic bags please! (Please refer to label – "Recycled" does not mean "Compostable"!)
		Place outside building in biodegradable waste container (DIN EN 840). Biodegradable waste placed in any other container type will not be collected. Collection every Friday, fortnightly in the winter months ² .
		Branch bundles (See "Branch bundles")
	Local recycling points ³	Lawn clippings and leaves (no branches, no kitchen waste). Place in official green waste sacks ²

Branch bundles (thin branches)	House-to-house collection ²	Use biodegradable string to bundle thin branches with a diameter of less than 1 cm. Max. diameter of branch bundles: 50 cm; max. length: 120 cm.
		Place on pavement/edge of road (Fridays, fortnightly in the winter months).
Building rubble	Schönenberg recycling point ¹	Non-flammable mineral waste such as pure building rubble, earth, stones, clay pots, window glass, aquariums, lead glass, vases, porcelain. During open hours1 only, up to a maximum of 120 litres per delivery day.
Bulbs, halogen lamps	Household waste	Bulbs (including halogen lamps) are not recycled. Do not place in the glass collection! LEDs, fluorescent tubes and energy-
		saving lamps are recycled separately (See "Fluorescent tubes").
Bulky waste	House-to-house collection ²	Bulky waste is combustible waste that does not fit in household rubbish sacks. Small bulky waste: Maximum $100 \times 50 \times 50$ cm in size (mattresses and rugs up to 100×200 cm), maximum 25 kilograms in weight. Collected together with household waste (Thursdays ²).
	Private waste disposal company ³	<u>Large bulky waste</u> : If your bulky waste exceeds the dimensions of $100 \times 50 \times 50 \text{ cm}$ (sofa, bed, skis, etc.), please contact a private waste disposal company of your choice for removal/return ³ .
Clay pots	Schönenberg recycling point ¹	During opening hours only 1 , up to a maximum of 120 litres (see "Building rubble")
Coffee capsules and pads	Werkhof	All aluminium and plastic coffee capsules, and plastic pads.
Earth	Schönenberg recycling point ¹	During opening hours only ¹ , up to a maximum of 120 litres (see "Building rubble")
Electrical and electronic equipment	Trade	Can be returned free of charge to all points of sale. No proof of purchase necessary.

Fluorescent tubes, LEDs and energy- saving lamps	Trade	Can be returned free of charge to all points of sale. No proof of purchase necessary.
Glass	Local recycling points ³	Dispose of packaging glass such as bottles and jam jars (without lids) according to colour. No lead glass, heat-resistant glass, plate glass, etc.
	Schönenberg recycling point ¹	Plate glass such as mirrors, window glass, heat-resistant glass, aquariums, lead glass, drinking glasses, glass bowls, vases, etc.
Hazardous waste		Hazardous waste from private households must be disposed of and recycled separately. Never mix! (chemical reactions) Never dispose of with household waste or pour down the drain! Return in original packaging wherever possible.
	Trade	Can be returned free of charge to all points of sale. No proof of purchase necessary.
Cleaning	Communal collection ²	Saturday, 11 June 2022 from 8.30 am to 12 noon ² .
products, paint, varnish, solvents, glue, acids, spray cans, fertilisers, herbicides, etc.	AUE Liestal	Please contact the Office of Environmental Protection and Energy (AUE) in Liestal in the case of larger quantities of hazardous waste from private households. Tel. 061 552 55 05
Household waste	House-to-house collection ²	Non-recyclable, combustible materials only. Place in sacks affixed with waste disposal stickers. Collection every Thursday ² .
Medicines	Trade	Return to pharmacy. Store in original packaging whenever possible, and do not mix.
Mercury thermometers	Trade	Return to pharmacy. Do not dispose of with household waste!
Metal	House-to-house collection ²	Bicycles, rims, pans, curtain poles, etc. up to 25 kilograms per item. Place clearly visible on pavement or edge of road on day of collection. Remove any other materials (wood, plastic, etc.). Place small metal items such as screws and nuts in containers that are easy to empty.
	Schönenberg recycling point ¹	During opening hours¹ only.
Paper and cardboard	House-to-house collection ²	Prepare paper and cardboard in bundles or place loose in a paper container (DIN EN 840). Collection last Tuesday of the month. The following should not be placed in the paper collection: toilet paper and tissues, paper towels, dirty paper such as pizza boxes, coated cardboard and
		composite paper such as drink cartons, food packaging, photos, receipts, shredded paper, etc.
PET	Trade	PET drink bottles only! No vinegar, oil or shampoo bottles, no PET trays.
Plastic packaging	House-to-house collection ²	Plastic packaging is not processed separately in Bottmingen, and should be placed in general household waste sacks.
Porcelain	Schönenberg recycling point ¹	During opening hours only ¹ , up to a maximum of 120 litres (see " <i>Building rubble"</i>).
Stones	Schönenberg recycling point ¹	During opening hours only:, up to a maximum of 120 litres (see "Building rubble").
Textiles (used clothes and shoes)	Local recycling points ³	Place clothes and shoes in collection container in sealed bags. Please tie shoes together in pairs. Ski boots are not collected.
Tin	Local recycling points ³	Place clean tin cans in the red recycling column at the local recycling points (processed together with aluminium). No spray cans (see "Hazardous waste").
Waste oil (motor and cooking oils)	Werkhof	Store engine and cooking oils separately in their original containers (do not mix). Can be taken to the Werkhof between 11 am and 12 noon on Tuesdays and handed to a member of Werkhof staff.
		Never pour down the drain or into the toilet!

¹ The Schönenberg recycling point is generally open from 10 am to 12 noon on the first Saturday in January, March, May, July, September and November. Address: Schönenbergweg, 4103 Bottmingen.
